Santa Fe Farmers' Market

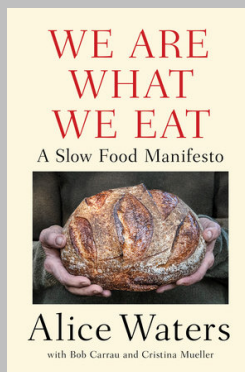
Seasonal produce from last weekend's market - beautiful!

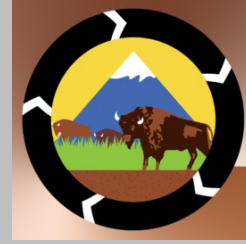
Tune in to *Slow Food Santa Fe Out Loud*
